## Argentina

Argentina was not a Member of the 1999 Food Aid Convention and its extensions.

## Australia

Australia is committed to providing a minimum of AUD 80 million of food assistance per calendar year under the Food Assistance Convention (FAC). All Australian funding is provided as untied cash-based support to the UN World Food Programme (WFP) and other UN agencies, and in fully grant form. In the 2021/22 Financial Year, Australia provided AUD 157.46 million through the WFP.

Australia's approach to food assistance allows the WFP flexibility to procure and deliver food assistance efficiently, effectively and in the timeliest way possible to those in need. Re-export is not applicable given Australia's approach to providing food assistance through the WFP.

Canada's financial assistance for food aid is based on humanitarian needs as set out in assessments and appeals by UN agencies, the Red Cross and INGOs.

## China

Consistent with the Bali Ministerial Declaration on Export Competition, Members shall continue to provide information on International Food Aid within the context of an annual examination process, based on the following structure:

### 2. Quantity and/or value of food aid provided

In 2019, China provided USD 22.9 million (cash) for food aid to seven countries including Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Namibia, Lesotho, Yemen, Congo (Brazzaville) and Dominica through the United Nations World Food Program.

In 2020, through the United Nations World Food Program and the United Nations Children's Fund, China provided USD 6 million (cash) for food aid to Ethiopia, Guinea, South Sudan, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

### 3. Description of whether food aid is provided on in-kind, untied cash-based basis and whether monetisation was permitted

Food aid is provided on cash basis.

### 4. Description of whether in fully grant form or concessional terms

The aid is provided in fully grant form with no concessional terms.

### 5. Description of relevant needs assessment (and by whom) and whether food aid is responding to a declaration of emergency or an emergency appeal (and by whom)

The cash-based transfer will be provided through WFP's SCOPE cards. A total of 21,765 individuals will be supported through the Austrian contribution - they will receive food vouchers which will be topped up with USD 13 per month over a duration of two months. The beneficiaries will be able to redeem the vouchers at a WFP selected retailer against food commodities of choice.*

*2) At the donation of EUR 800,000 to WFP for Yemen Interim Country Strategic Plan 2019-2022:*

*Funding from the Government of Austria will enable the delivery of critically needed food assistance to populations whose access to food has been further restricted by the crisis in Ukraine. The contribution will be used to implement WFP's general food assistance programmes by covering the cost of procurement of key food commodities which are part of the standard ration. New funding support is critically needed given the increase in WFP's operating costs due to the Ukraine crisis,*

In 2022, the budget allocated to the French Food Assistance Programme (managed by the Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs with the support of the Inter-ministerial Committee for Food Aid/CIAA) amounted for EUR 140,352,185, including additional credits for Ukraine ( EUR 3 million) as well as for the action of the World Food Programme (WFP) in response to the world food crisis aggravated by the Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, within the framework of the FARM initiative ( Food and Agriculture Resilience Mission).

118 interventions were funded, targeting just over 5.4 million direct beneficiaries in 47 countries (compared to 37 countries served in 2021).

More than 66% of this aid went to Africa (66.18%/EUR 92.9 million). The G5 Sahel countries were allocated 24.82% of the credits/EUR 34.83 million.

Then come the MENA region (14.75%/EUR 20.7 million), Asia (7.30%/EUR 10.25 million), Americas/Caribbean (6.07%/8.5 million EUR) and Ukraine (5.70%/8 million EUR).

France's 19 priority countries for official development aid (1) received 54% of the funding.

The main operator of this programme remains the WFP, with EUR 85.05 million in 2022 – including EUR 25 million in additional credits obtained within the framework of FARM, in response to the worsening of the world food crisis (see above). WFP is followed by the ICRC, the French NGO Action contre la Faim (ACF), the French NGO Solidarités International, UNICEF, FAO and UNRWA, in particular. In total: (i) international organizations benefit from 70.45% of credits (EUR 98.88 million); (ii) civil society organizations, from 28.84% (EUR 40.47 million): the ICRC, for 6.31% (EUR 8.85 million), and various non-governmental organizations, for 22.53 % (EUR 31.62 million). Bilateral support for Niger (National Food Crisis Prevention and Management System: DNP-GCA) represents 0.71% of credits (EUR 1 million).

Needs assessments are established on an annual basis (SOFI, Global Network against Food crises, ...), and provided regularly by the Integrated Phase Classification (IPC) and Cadre Harmonisé (CH) analyses, or through reports such as the Hunger Hotspots/FAO-WFP early warnings on acute food insecurity, or through the DG-ECHO (European Commission), the Food Assistance Committee (Food Assistance Convention), French embassies, NGOs or International Organizations.

In order to stimulate the markets and local production in the countries concerned, Switzerland encourages the WFP and its NGO partners to deliver assistance in cash by default, and otherwise to purchase locally or regionally produced goods. For example, 32% of WFP beneficiaries in 2022 received cash assistance. Monetization has not been applied.

### 4. Description of whether in fully grant form or concessional terms

All Swiss food aid is provided in fully grant form, without concessional terms (see question 5).

### 5. Description of relevant needs assessment (and by whom) and whether food aid is responding to a declaration of emergency or an emergency appeal (and by whom)

Switzerland works closely with the WFP and its NGO partners. Its contributions are based on the 2021-24 International Cooperation Strategy. The WFP, like Switzerland's NGO partners, plans its operations on the basis of vulnerability analyses and mapping, published periodically by the WFP and shared with partners in local humanitarian coordination forums (food security clusters). The WFP aligns itself with emergency appeals of the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA).

With the trend being for food crises to last longer and longer, Switzerland's contributions are made in response to emergency appeals only in exceptional cases, such as in Ukraine in 2022.

### 6. Description of whether re-export of food aid is an option under the terms of the provision of food aid

The re-export of food aid is not permitted.

Each food aid contract gives very clear instructions on where the food aid should be landed and no transshipment is allowed. The contract also forbids resale or conversion into other usage in the local or foreign markets.

Emergency food assistance is provided based on populations in need, and a disaster declaration is not a pre-requisite for response.

U.S. food assistance for non-emergency development/capacity building is provided by private voluntary organizations, cooperatives, governments of developing countries and their agencies, universities, the WFP and other international organizations. The U.S. Government works with the implementing organizations and the recipient governments to analyze markets and choose agricultural products that will not disrupt local production, prices, local markets, or commercial trade. Consistent with the Food Assistance Convention reporting, these assessments can be done by U.S. Government experts or by contracting with an independent third party.
